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New York, April 12.—The steamer City of Baltimore arrived this morning, with four days later dates.
Warlike preparations continue active.
The Peace Congress will meet on the 1st of May probable at Baden.
The Austrian force in Lombardy amounts to 220,000 men.
The Reform debate in Parliament continued.
Markets.—Breadstuffs dull. Provisions unchanged. Consols 95½ to 95½.



LATEST FROM EUROPE.

New York, April 13th.—The Europa arrived this A. M. Consols closed on Friday at 95½ to 95½.
LIVERPOOL, 2d.—Breadstuffs continue dull; four 10s to 12s 6d; in wheat and corn little doing; provisioner firmer; coffee scarce and firm; sugar active; tea quiet but steady.
Steamer Prince Albert would not sail till April 9th.
The Government were defeated on the second reading of the Reform Bill by thirty-nine majority. Cabinet undecided, but its determination would be announced on the 4th inst.
The resignation of the Ministry was generally anticipated.
The second Irish rebellion trial resulted in the conviction and sentence of the prisoner for ten years to penal servitude.
Nothing definite in regard to peace or war.
The place of the meeting of the Peace Congress has not been settled.

Supposed Seizure of Cuba.

New York, April 13.
The Sun of this morning raises the free flag of Cuba, under the firm belief that that island is now in the hands of a general revolution. It is not already in the hands of the patriots. The Sun says a band of Cuban patriots sailed from this port the latter part of March, with arms, ammunition, &c. Most of them are young men, sons of the leading men of the island, all determined to free their native soil or die in the attempt. Their landing was to be the signal for revolt, to the patriots already on the island.
The first of April was the day fixed upon. The Isabel at Charleston, brings dates to 10th inst.

A Man Revolving in the Wheel of a Steamboat.

On Saturday morning, a man was driven by the severe sale of Saturday, from the shore, near Albany, in a boat, without the oars. He was paddling along with a piece of board which he found in the boat, as the steamer Eagle was making her downward trip. The pilot, Mr. Fyfe Hunter, did not see the unfortunate man, and the boat drifted directly under one of the paddle wheels of the Eagle, which broke it to pieces. To save himself the man clung to one of the paddles of the wheel, and was carried up the wheel-house, where he was badly hurt before his cries were heard. The boat was immediately stopped, and the poor fellow rescued from his horrible position. He was very seriously, though, it is hoped, not badly injured.

FOUND DEAD.—A man named Donald Moore, was found dead last week near Mulher's shipyard, Quaco. An inquest was held, and the body of deceased man was buried. Suspicions of foul play having arisen, a post mortem examination was held, and two cuts were discovered on his head. It also appeared on investigation that when found a pocket in his pants was cut out, and the money missing that he had with him previous to his death.—[Globe.]

The bishop and clergy of Rupert's Land (Red River) have petitioned the House of Lords to abolish the rule of the Hudson Bay Company, on expiry of the lease and license, and make it a colony under the Crown; also in favor of free trade, against the renewal of exclusive privileges to the Hudson's Bay Company, and to place all her Majesty's subjects in the Indian territory on an equality.
