

DRIVERS MUST KEEP LEFT SIDE

POLICE TO ENFORCE THE CIVIC BY-LAWS

Turning Corners Sharply and Fast Driving Will Lead to Police Court.

Drivers of vehicles of all sorts would do well to note that the civic by-law respecting driving on the public thoroughfares is going to be strictly enforced. Hereafter the proper side of the road—the left—must be kept, corners must be turned clearly and the speed limit must be observed.

AGAIN REMANDED.

G. L. Middleton is to be tried on an Altered Charge. The charge of stealing furniture valued at \$400 preferred against G. L. Middleton in the police court yesterday morning, on which the accused was remanded, was dismissed in the police court this morning and a charge of obtaining \$185.55 by false pretenses from Maynard & Sons, auctioneers, was substituted.

Accused elected to be tried by the higher court and was remanded until tomorrow morning, when the evidence will be heard. J. A. Alkman again asked for an order that the draft in the possession of the police which was found on accused should be handed over to him. The magistrate, however, considered accused would be at no inconvenience without it as he is still in jail, having been unable to obtain the \$1,000 bail set yesterday. No application for bail was made this morning on the new charge.

ORDERING LOCOMOTIVES. Dunkirk, N. Y., May 20.—The Buffalo placed an order with the Brooks plant of the American Locomotives company for ten freight engines and one passenger engine. A western route is said to have given an order for fifty locomotives.
