(2) A homesteader may, if he so desires, perform the required residence duties by living on farming land 'owned solely by him, not less than eighty (80) acres in extent, in the vicinity of his homestead. He may also do so by living with father or mother, on certain conditions. Joint ownership in land will not meet this requirement.

(3) A homesteader may, if he so desires, perform his residence duties in accordance with the above while living with parents or on farming land owned by himself must motify the Agent for the district of such intention.

(2) A homesteader may, if he so desires, perform the required residence duties of that some opposition will be offered at the council meeting, and use of the town hall advocated for the present, or until debt on present school building is paid.

Any even-numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, excepting 8 and 26, not reserved, may be homesteaded by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section of 160 acres, more or less.
