THE opinion is expressed in a United States newspaper that within the next five years electricity will to a large degree displace steam on all the great railroads of the country. There are said to be now in operation in the United States no less than 425 electric roads, of which 40 have been opened during the past nine months. These are all comparatively short distance roads, but a road is now in process of construction between St. Louis and Chicago, to be opened next year in time for the World's Fair, in which electricity will be the motive power, and on which it is expected that its express trains will run at a speed of 100 miles an hour. The underground electric system in London, during the eighteen months in which it has been in operation, has carried more than 7,000,000 passengers.
