

The Association then resumed its sitting, and the Moderator expressed his gratification at the harmony and good feeling which had characterized the proceedings, and his earnest hope that good had been done in the community.

Dr. Cramp dwelt for a few moments on the fact that the Statistics shewed such a small increase, and urged the brethren to renewed diligence and more earnest prayer.

Some remarks were made by Brothers King and Griffiths in reference to monies collected for a meeting house in Pictou, which resulted in the understanding that Bro. King should, for the present, keep the money at interest.

*Resolved*, That the Treasurer be directed to pay over the various monies sent to the Associations, after deducting the sum necessary for expenses, to the Treasurers of the several Funds.

After prayer by Rev. Dr. Cramp, the singing of the Union Hymn, and pronouncement of the benediction by the Moderator, the Association adjourned to meet with the Baptist Church at Great Village on the first Saturday in July, 1862, at 2 o'clock P. M.
