BYE-LAWS.

ARTICLE I.—MEMBERS' FEE.

Members received into the Association shall pay an annual fee of Two Dollars, payable on admission, and on the first of January in each year there-

ARTICLE II.—DUTY OF OFFICERS.

- 1. It shall be the duty of the President, and in his absence of the senior Vice-President present, to preside at meetings of the Association and General
- 2. It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to receive all monies and disburse the same under the direction of the General Committee. He shall present a full and correct account of his transactions to the annual meeting and
- 3. The General-Committee shall manage all the affairs of the Association and make bye-laws for its government. They shall appoint the Secretary and fix his salary, and shall report fully to the Association at the Quarterly and Annual Meetings. They shall appoint the following Standing Committees, and such other Committees as may be required, viz.: A Committee on Missions and Devotions; on Finance; Literary and Social Committee; on Membership; on Strangers and Employment; on Temperance; on Tract Distribution; on University of the Committee of the Committee on Membership; on Strangers and Emproyment; on Temperance, on The Visiting Sick; and on Rooms and Library. Seven members shall form a quorum for the transaction of business.
- 4. The Board of Trustees shall discharge their duties under the direction of the General Committee, and shall present a full report of their preceedings to the Association at the Annual Meeting.
- 5. It shall be the duty of the Recording Secretary to keep a record of all meetings of the Association and Committees, and of the name, residence and Church of each member, notify all efficers and members of their election or appointment, and prepare the work for the Business Meeting. He shall collect membership dues and subscriptions, and pay the same over to the Treasurer. He shall also act as Librarian, and generally under the direction of the

ARTICLE III.—STANDING COMMITTEES.
