Dear Mr. McLean:-

I am herewith enclosing for your information the newspaper account of what has taken place at the meetings held in this city from the 7th to the 11th inclusive between the Executive Committee of the Allied Indian Tribes of British Columbia and Dr. Duncan C. Scott, Deputy Superintendent-General, and myself. The newspaper item is fairly accurate, though the typewritten report may show that there are some other things which the Indians request for the extinguishment of their Aboriginal Title in lieu of their case being submitted to the Courts for a judicial decision. As the transcript will not be available for some days I thought it would be just as well to supply you with this, also a copy for the Honourable the Minister, though it may be possible that Dr. Scott has already done this. He left to-day for California and will return to Victoria on the 23rd, when he will leave for the East but I believe he has to call at a few points on the way.
