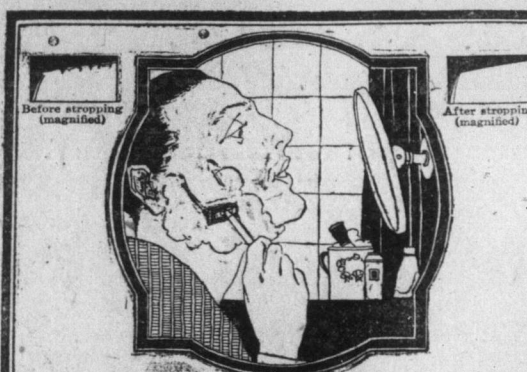

Toronto Will Have Many O. H. A. Teams.

The Sportsmen's Patriotic Association extended an invitation to H. R. H. the Prince of Wales to attend a hockey match at the Toronto Arena, Monday night, Nov. 3. The proceeds of the match to be given to the Navy League, toward whose drive the S. P. A. has promised to raise \$500.

The teams chosen to put on the match are Denials and St. Patrick's. The game will be in the Arena for slating Wednesday, Oct. 22, and it will give the hockey players a chance to limber up for the match.

President Frank S. Ashplant, who was re-elected for 1919-20 introduced a motion which was heartily received. It being a proposal to set aside certain evenings during the beginning of the next season for the purpose of teaching new curlers the rudiments of the game. This measure was adopted and Messrs. F. H. Hindmarsh, W. J. Snelgrove, Dr. A. J. Wright and F. S. Ashplant were appointed instructors.

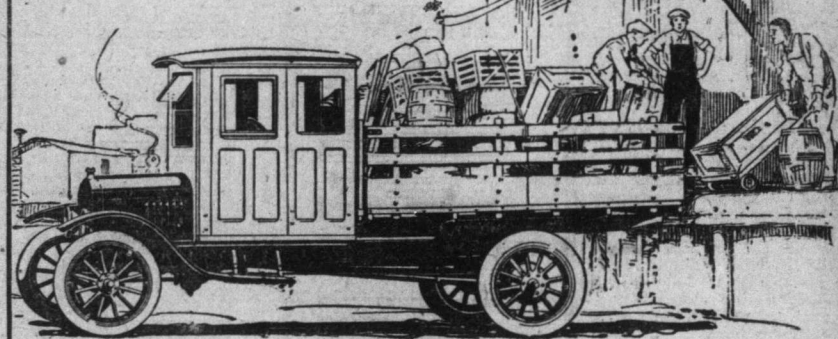

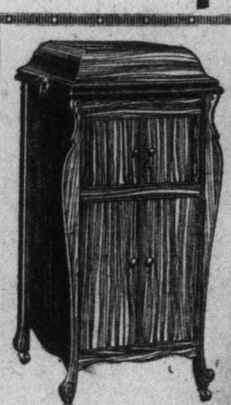
