## CAP II.

An ACT to confirm and make valid in Law all manner of Process and Proceedings in the several Courts of Judicature within this Island, from the first day of May, One Thousand Seven Hundred and Sixty-nine, to this present Session of Assembly.

TATHEREAS this Island has been without a complete Legislature from the commencement of the Government thereof, which took place on the First day of May One Thousand Seven Hundred and Sixty-nine, unto this present Session of Assembly; during which time many and various Proceedings have been had at the several Courts of Judicature in this Island:

Be it therefore enacted, by the Governor, Council and Assembly, That all Writs, Pleas, Process, Actions, Bills, Suits, Indictments, Informations, Judg- Pleas, &c. ments and Decrees, of or concerning any matter or thing whatsoever, which have been heretofore in any Court sued out and prosecuted to Judgment in any of the within this Issaid several Courts within this Island, from and afform the first of May of May One Thousand Se. 1769 to the end of this present ven Hundred and Sixty-nine, to the end of this Session, confirmation of the session of present Session of Assembly, shall be good and valid in the Law: Provided always, that this Act shall not be construed to extend to take away or rectify errors in the misusing of Process, Mispleadings, and erroneous rendering of Judgment in point of Law: But in all such cases, the Parties aggrieved may have their Writ or Writs of Error. Error upon such erroneous Judgment, in such manner as they might have done before the making of this Act.
