Gulf develops efficient low-pollution oil burner

Another anti-pollution breakthrough was announced this week by Gulf Oil Canada Limited which, with the Ontario Research Foundation at Sheridan Park, has developed a highly efficient low-pollution oil burner.

The burner, known as the "Vortometric" took \$500,000 and seven years to develop.

Gulf Canada has applied for Canadian and foreign patents on the burner which has already received U.S. patent protection.

The company will license the design to equipment manufacturers on a non-exclusive royalty basis.

Mr. R.M. Donald, manager of the company's research and development division, says the burner appears well suited for a wide range of industrial applications in the middle ground between the huge burners used in thermal electric generating plants and the small units used in commercial and home heating.

"Preliminary discussions have been held with several international manufacturers and widespread interest is expected in this Canadian development," Mr. Donald added.

VORTEX

The Vortometric burner creates a whirling vortex of fuel and air to achieve essentially complete and

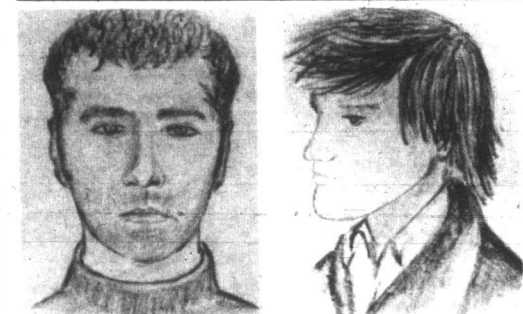
smokeless combustion of even the heaviest petroleum fuels under low excess air conditions.

Formation of particulates is also greatly reduced, but sulphur dioxide continues to be mainly a factor of the amount of sulphur in the fuel. The burner, however, can be switched to any combination of liquid fuel and natural gas operation during adverse weather conditions.

According to Gulf Canada, the burner also offers about

a five per cent fuel saving, an extremely wide range of efficient operation and significantly reduced operating control and maintenance costs.

Ten custom-made burners have been placed in service by the company already and 26 more of the larger units are ready to fire up the crude heaters in Gulf Canada's new refinery nearing completion at Point Tupper, N.S.

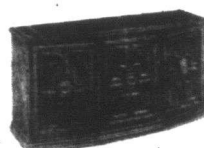

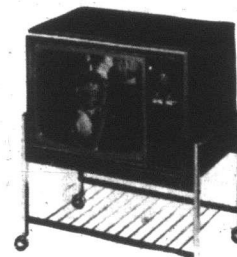

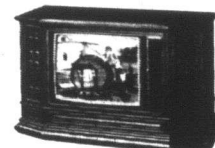
