'There are no facilities for four to eight-year-olds in the Mississauga Valleys area" claims director of the project, Irene Bajer. "Even if we didn't receive the if we didn't receive the grant, we still would have gone ahead with the camp" she adds.

Working out of St. Mary's Dormition Catholic Church, the summer camp will be in operation from July 7 to August 30, 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. every day, excluding weekends. There will be a 75 cent daily fee for arts and crafts materials, ice-cream, juice and various outings. Irene says a good deal of research went into the idea, especially consultations with child psychologist Donna Pachuta as to what activities would be best for the

children. Letters of recommendation for the grant came from Mayor Martin Dobkin, the Ukrainian Canadian Committee, Peel South M.P.P. Doug Kennedy and incumbent M.P. Don Blenkarn.

speaker if possible, Our Friends Under the Sea, Topsy Turvy Day, which involves changing around a day's program from front to back offering the children some variety, Animals In The Forest and countless

The Forest and countless additional topics. A typical day will begin with free play in the hall followed by the official greeting and puppets in-troducing the day's theme. Games and physical ac-tivity will lead to story time and arts and crafts. The and arts and crafts. The children's parents are responsible for packed

lunches. "The afternoon activities will take place out-of-doors" describes Irene, "with strenous exercises, park outings, scavage hunts, follow-the-signs games, nature trail walks and a juice break." The group has access to a

educational source of entertainment for the kids and on nature days, the coun-sellors shall utilize special trails. By the use of various forms of games and stories, the trips will hopefully instill a feeling of respect and love for the world in which the kids exist.

Helping Irene in this endeavour, are two high school students, Natalie Berezowsky and Joanne Kozlowskyj, as well as another university student, Oksana Pelech. All four are in pursuit of child development careers. The organizers hope that


