## **Automobile** pollution tests

Motorists using Dixie Road can expect to be flagged down and asked to voluntarily submit their cars to a provincial government pollution test starting

Monday.
Officials of the Ministry of the Environment say drivers have nothing to fear from the series of tests which will be held for two weeks near Dixie Plaza.

If an auto's exhaust, is found to be over the acceptable pollution limit the driver will be urged to have a tune-up. There is rarely any spot of any problems while in tune-up. There is rarely any

The testing bus was set up in Port Credit between July 4 and 14 and will be back in the lakeshore town on Sept. 5 for

another 10-day stay.
Police flagged down cars on Lakeshore Road and asked them to participate in the test. Port Credit Police Sergeant Don Thomson claimed most drivers were happy to participate in the testing procedure and said he was surprised by the number who drove up and volunteered to take part.

Between 30 and 50 cars a


