Living near Montreal in Canada
Two Cacheauage Indians, named Leonado &
Cahowage bring am^r here in form the Com^r that
twenty days ago they overtook a party of Onnagunge
Indians who live at St. Francis that were going with
am^rage to the Indians who are at hunting to return
to their habitations. the said party of Indians told above
two Indians that they had been at Quebec and seen the
now Gov^r there who had sent for the Chief of the lastren Indians
of nine severall Castles to whom he made a speech
which of them had made peace with the people of New
England, the Chief of three Castles Noddup & said that they
had concluded ^{with them} peace on which the Governor told them
that since they ~~were~~ were turned English men
he would not assist nor protect them. but order the priest
who lives among them, to leave their habitation. and
would assist & protect the Indians of the other six Castles
with what they have occasion for. having received a
Ship laden with ~~good~~ all sorts of goods fitt for their use
and made them a present of ~~iron~~ powder &c. and told
them he had orders from the King his Master to furnish
them with what they have occasion for to prosecute the
war against the people of New England who possess
their Land to which they have no manner of right.

The said two Indians ad that four parties of
Indians who formerly lived at Naringewach were gone out
fighting from St. Francis against New England. but do
not know how many days its ago since they went out nor
