He is now in arrears \$367.07 and the Department does not feel justified in corrying this settler much longer if he is not going to prove a better settler.

Mr. Sexumith reports that he has had eleknose during the past winter but that his stock and implements are in good shape and that he has promised to make payments this year. The Department is not desirous of going after this estiler in any way to discourage his but I would ask you, as Indian agent to give his some attention this summer to assist him to make a success of farming and also to urge upon him the necessity of trying to live up to his agreement to make repayments on his loan.
