Dear Mr. Williams:

I thank you very much for your letter of 6th. You have explained the matter quite clearly and I am in entire agreement with you as to the whole cause of the trouble.

I am quite willing to give Gerald a cheque for \$100.00 and feel sure I can get another \$100.00 here, providing arrangements can be made to get the balance to pay off these taxes. Apparently, however, the money sent from Montreal has not been applied on taxes, and I do not know where he is going to get money to pay the balance. It would be quite worthless for me to be sending up my own money if it does not get him anywhere.

Gerald has written me this morning urging me to send some money on. You may show him this letter. It was on the understanding that the whole money would be secured and that I would help secure it that I told him I would contribute. As far as I can see little, if any, of the money obtained so far has gone on taxes.
