of Evidence in the case of M6234 Acting Serjeant Illingworth, D., innipeg Grenadiers (M.G.) C.A.S.F.

H6064 Pte. Cooper, H., H.Q. Company, The Winnipeg Grenediers (M.C.) C.A.S.F being called, states:

"I am H6064 Pte. Cooper, H., a soldier in The Winnipeg Grenadiers (M.G.) C.A.S.P.

I have been working in the Men's Mess Hall, Fort Osborne Barracks, Tuxedo, Manitoba, as a cook for the past three months and knew that groceries were going out frequently but I believed they were being traded for other groceries that were not on Army rations. such as, pies, cakes, cookies and fresh milk, etc. I never thought or suspected that anything was wrong until 30 Merch, 1940, a Saturday afternoon, At three o'clock I was detailed by Serjeant Cook Illingworth to give the McMaster's Market truck driver the following rations:

50 lbs. butter

2 cases corned beef 2 cases canned milk

100 lbs. sugar

2 boxes of Canadian Cheese

1 case of eggs (30 dozen)

I marked them down on a piece of paper which I handed back to Serjeant Illingworth after Private Ambrose had checked the groceries to see if I gave the right groceries.

McMaster's driver, whom I now know as J. Backman, handed me twelve dollars, cash, and told me to give Serjeant Illingworth the money and that he would know what it was for. Private Ambrose was present when I received this money from the driver. This transaction took place before I gave the driver the groceries. I gave Serjeant Illingworth the twelve dollars and he put them in his pocket. I went back to the kitchen and saw that McMaster's driver had loaded the groceries in his truck. He told me just as he was leaving to tell Serjeant Illingworth that he would see him on Monday."

Capt. Bailie: Private Cooper, I show you as Exhibit "1", certain stores. Do you recognize them as the stores mentioned in your statement?

Pte. Cooper: Yes Sir.

Capt. Bailie: Private Gooper, can you identify this men? (J. Backman)

Pte. Cooper: Yes Sir.

Capt. Bailie: Who is he?

Answer: He drives McMaster's truck Sir.

Capt. Bailie: Is he the usual driver for McMaster's Market?

Answer: I have seen him in the kitchen before, making deliveries.

Capt. Bailie: Serjeant Illingworth, do you wish to cross examine the witness?

Answer: No Sir.

PAR. Hugh. Booker.

The accused declines to cross examine this witness.
