The outline of the work is simple. After an interesting introduction, the national government is considered in Pt. 1. Pt. 2 covers the state and municipal governments. Pt. 3 is a study of the party system in extraordinary detail. In Pt. 4 public opinion here is analyzed and emphasized. Pt. 5 consists of illustrations and reflections on specific features of our system, and Pt. 6 takes up the social incidents of the country, such as railroads, Wall street, the Universities, the position of women, etc., as illustrative of our general status. The notes and appendices are very full and very valuable.
