Any even numbered section of Dominien Lands in Manitoba or the North-West Territories, excepting 5 and 20, which has not been home-sizeded, or reserved to privide vood lots for settlers, or for other purposes, may be homestended upon by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one quarter section, of 160 acres, more or less.

BNTRY.

Entry may be made personally at the local land office for the district in which the land to be taken is situate, or if the homesteader desires, he may, on application to the Minister of the Interior, Ottawa, the Com-missioner of Immigration, Winnipeg, or the local agent for the district in which the land is situate, receive authority for some one to make eatry for him. A fee of \$1000 is charged for a homestead entry. HOMESTEAD DUTIES.

A settler who has been knamed an entry for a homestead is required by the provisions of the Dominion Lands Act and the amendments thereto, to perform the conditions connected therewith, under one of the following plans:-

(1) At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land each year during the term of three years.

10 each year during the term of three years.
(2) If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased) of any person who is eligible to make a homestead entry under the provisions of this Act; reades upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for by such person as a homestead, the requirements of this Act; as to residence prior to obtaining patent may be satisfied by such person residing with the father or mother.

(3) If a sottler was entitled to and has obtained entry for a second omestend, the requirements of this Act as to residence prior to obtain-g patent may be satisfied by residence upon the first homestend, if he second homestend is in the vicinity of the first homestend.

(4) If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the said land. The term "vicinity" used above is meant to indicate the same towa, township or an adjoining or cornering township.

A settler who avails himself of the provisions of Clauses (2), (3) or (4) must cultivate 30 acres of his homestead, or substitute 20 head of slock, with buildings for their accommodation, and have besides \$0acres substantially fenced.

The privilege of a second entry is restricted by law to those settlers may who completed the duties upon their first homesteads to entitle hem to patent on or before the 2nd June, 1859. Every homesteader who fails to comply with the requirements of the comestead law is liable to are his entry cancelled, and the land may e again thrown open for entry. APPLICATION FOR PATENT

should be made at the end of three years, before the Local Agent, Sub-Agent, or the Homestead Isspector. Before making application for patent, the settler must give six months' notice in writing to the Com-missioner of Dominion Lands, at Ottawa, of his intention to of so.

INFORMATION.

Newly arrived immigrants will receive at the immigration office in Winnipeg or at any Dominion Lands Office in Manitoba or the North-West Territories, information as to the lands that are open for entry, and from the officers in charge, free of expense, advice and assistance in securing land to suit them. Full information respecting the land timber, coal and minoral laws, as well as respecting Dominion Lands in the Railway Beit in British Columbia, may be obtained upon enplic-tion to the Secretary of the Department of the Interior, Ottaws, the Commissioner of Immigration, Winnipeg, Manttoba, or to any of the Dominion Land Agents in Manitoba or the North-West Territories.
