## GREAT BRITAIN'S DRINK BILL, 1893.

An estimate of the drink bill of Great Britain and Ireland for the years 1892-3 was embodied in the annual report of the United Kingdom Alliance, presented at the recent annual meeting. It was in these terms :-

As the official estimate of the population of the United Kingdom for the middle of 1893 was $38,429,992$, the expenditure per head on alcoholic liquors was $£ 312 \mathrm{~s} .6 \mathrm{~d}$., or $£ 181 \mathrm{~s} .3 \mathrm{~d}$. for each family of five persons. For 1892 the expenditure per head was $£ 313 \mathrm{~s}$. 11d. and $£ 189 \mathrm{~s}$. 7 d .
