And being returned,

Mr. Ritchie reported that the Managers had been at the conference, and flated the substance of the conference to the House.

On motion, resolved, That a further conference be desired with the Council on the subject matter of the Treasury Note Bill, and that the Clerk do request the same.

On motion, the House resolved itself into a committee of the whole House, to consider further of a Supply.

Mr. James took the Chair,

Mr. Speaker refumed the Chair.

The Chairman reported from the Committee that they had made some progress in the business to them referred, and had come to everal resolutions thereupon, which they had directed him to report to the House, and he read the same in his place, and afterwards delivered them in at the Clerk's Table, where they were read and are as follow:

Resolved, That it is the opinion of this committee, that the sum of 8501. should be granted to the Commissioner for erecting Cranberry Island Light-House, to complete the said Light House, agreeably to an Estimate laid before the Committee of Public Accounts.

Resolved, That it is the opinion of this committee, that the fum of 200l. should be grant-

ed for the following purposes, viz.

One hundred pounds to rebuild the Bridge over Clyde River in the County of Shelburne. Entry pounds to rebuild the Bridge over Jordan River. And Fifty Pounds to rebuild the Bridge over Sable River in the faid County. The faid Bridges having been carried away by a Freshet on the 10th inst.

Resolved, That it is the opinion of this committee, that the sum of 100l. should be grantred for the main Road from Noel Village, opposite Londonderry, to Thompson's

Farm on the Beaver Bank Road, leading to Halifax.

Resolved, That it is the opinion of this committee, that the sum of 2001. should be granted to aid the Inhabitants on the Gulf of St. Lawrence, towards finishing the Pier at Arisag Point.

Refolved, That it is the opinion of this committee, that the sum of 201. should be granted in addition to 301. already appropriated, to build a Bridge over the West Branch of the North River in Onslow, near Daniel M'Cullam's.

Resolved, That it is the opinion of this committee, that the fum of 201 should be granted to Jacob Ruston, a new Settler on the New Road from Remsheg to West Chester, he being of service to Travellers on that Road, there being no Inhabitants settled within many miles of his residence.

Resolved, That it is the opinion of this committee, that the sum of 456l. 15s. 72d. should be granted to pay the Balance due to the Commissioners of Light-Houses, to the

31st December last, as reported by the committee of Public Accounts.

Resolved. That it is the opinion of this committee, that the sum of 50l. should be granted to affish the Inhabitants of Blandford to finish the road towards Hammond Plain Road leading from Chester to Halifax.
