Bellview Is Growing New School Needed

But There Is Difference of Opinion Among Rate-payers as to Best Plans—Meeting Last Night

A meeting of the ratepayers of school section No. 23, Bellview school, was held in the school room last night for the purpose of considering the advisability of giving the board of school trustees the authority to issue debentures to raise the sum of \$23,000 for the purpose of enlarging the present school.

On motion moved by J. Vrooman, seconded by Alex. Robinson, it was decided to do so, but John Robertson, after the motion was carried, rose to a point of order and demanded that a ballot be taken, and after some discussion it was decided to adjourn the meeting until some future date.

R. Edwards acted as chairman of the meeting and Robert Collier officiated as secretary.

At the commencement of the meeting the chairman called upon Secretary to read the minutes of the previous meeting and also the following resolution: That the Board of Trustees of School Section No. 23, of the Township of Brantford, with the consent and sanction of the ratepayers of said School Section, first obtained at a special meeting called for that purpose, hereby apply to the Council of the Township of Brantford to pass a by-law for the purpose of borrowing the sum of \$23,000 from the Ontario municipalities fund or from any other source, such sums to be repaid in thirty yearly equal payments of both principal and interest said interest to be at the rate of 5 per cent per annum; such yearly payments to be payable out of the taxable property of said section and such sum when borrowed to be used for the purpose of making an addition to the school house of said school section and improvements of the school property.

The Discussion Mr. Champion rose and stated that he was in favor of the motion.

Robert Henry was of the opinion that as there was at present not enough room in the school, that the building should be increased by five rooms, and that it was best to look into the future and provide all, including accommodation for the children.

Architect Present The chairman requested Architect L. Taylor to go over the plans of the proposed new building, and explain same to those present, which he did, saying that it would cost practically \$2000 per room to make the building up-to-date. He cited other schools which cost \$5,000 per room to build.

Tassee, H. Atwell stated that to raise the \$23,000, it would mean an increase of 1.34 cents per \$1,000 assessment, and he was greatly in favor of having the work done. He further stated that the 35 children who are present attending a school room being used in the old Parkdale hotel, and 80 to 100 pupils were ready to attend the school as soon as same was completed. The average attendance at Bellview school and annex for the month of March was 252.

P. Fisher asked the chairman and Architect Taylor a number of questions re. cost of construction, ventilation, etc.

John Robertson made a lengthy address in which he stated that he was in favor of building a new four room school on a site to be chosen on the Mohawk Road, claiming that the children living in the vicinity of the Starch Works had too long a walk to get to the present school and talk of the difficulties of getting there in cold and disagreeable weather.
