Two girls stood side by side stirring vigorously. Finally one reached for the hot milk. "What!, Have you got yours smooth already?" asked the other girl, who was still struggling with some obstinate lumps. "Not quite," said the first girl impatiently, "but I guess it's near enough," and she poured in the hot milk.

The other girl went on stirring a little while longer until the mixture was really smooth.


