DEATH OF REV. CANON CHANCE.

He Was a Member of the Anglican Church and a Well Known Man.

Paris, Oct. 11.—This morning early in the day of a most sudden death of Rev. Canon Chance, father-in-law of Dr. McArthur.

He was in Ambleside, on the banks of the Stour, Worcestershire, England, engaged at the Episcopal school of Red Hill and at the College of Cheltenham, but before graduating he received an urgent call to undertake missionary work among the Indians on the north shore of Lake Huron and Superior.

According to this call he left England in 1853, under the auspices of the S.P.G., with the promise of ordination in Canada, and was subsequently ordained by the first Bishop of Toronto, Right Rev. John Strachan making his home at Garden River. It was the only missionary of the Church of England in that vast country other than Dr. O'Meara, Government chaplain to the Indians of Manitowish Islands.

He declined the offer, in 1870, of Government, Ont., Church, also the mission of Kanjunge among the Six Nations, by Bishop Cronyn of Huron diocese, feeling that it was his duty to remain in Canada.

He was again re-elected to the same office by Hon. Mr. Balfour, to accept their offered charge. This time he yielded, leaving his wife and children, and his removal from Toronto to Huron diocese, in 1871, when he was appointed Bishop of Huron, and in 1872, Bishop of Huron and St. Catharines.

In 1880 he was made, by Right Rev. Mr. S. Davidson, Bishop of Huron, a Canon of St. Paul's Cathedral, London, Ontario, and in 1881, a member of the Synod of the Diocese of Huron.
