TURKEYS, GEESSE AND DUCKS

DIRECTIONS FOR DRESSING Keep from food for 24 hours before killing, so that crop will be entirely empty

Pick turkeys dry. Scald geese and ducks light

Draw the entrails in a clean and neat manner.

Cut the heads off, bring the skin over the neck and tie with a stout cord. Leave feet on, have them well cleaned, but do not scald them.

Kill day before bringing to market and keep in a cool dry place.

POOR POULTRY NOT WANTED. Be sure and have your poultry drawn clean and crops empty.

All poultry buyers will be welcomed at this fair.

Do not contract your poultry before coming to market.
