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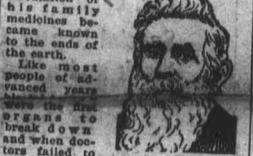

Dr. Sawyer Is Named New President.

Dr. Sawyer is named as the new president of the Baptist Convention at South Hill. The convention was held at South Hill, and the decision of the convention to temporarily close Okanagan College, the election of new officers, and the adoption of various reports of committees.

An injunction to restrain the publication and selling of the Nova Scotia Readers was refused by the Supreme Court of Ontario. The facts are stated by the 'Toronto Telegram' of June 30th, 1915, as follows:

An attempt by the Morang Educational Co. to hang up 92,000 school readers which the T. Eaton Co. has contracted to supply to the province of Nova Scotia failed before Mr. Justice Middleton this morning. The T. Eaton Co. entered on a four-year contract, ending in 1918, to supply the Nova Scotia schools, and had been instructed to ship the initial lot, which have already been printed. It is said that if they are not shipped at once they will not arrive in time for the next school term.

The Morang Educational Co. states that it has a ten year authorization which does not expire till July 1st, 1915. The injunction asked for to restrain the T. Eaton Co. publishing or selling Nova Scotia readers was refused.
