led in the desired direction. These many  
difficulties, however, led us to make the

some route or road. On the day

**BIG TOBIQUE MOOSE**  
RECENT EXPERIENCE OF A NOTED SPORTSMAN  
IN HUNTING THE GAME IN NEW  
BRUNSWICK.

Among the sportsmen who noted American  
sportsmen who hunted moose in New  
Brunswick last season was Mr. F. H.  
Cook. Mr. Cook has recently described  
in Hunting and Fishing in the following

Early in September we left the Tobique  
river near Riley brook, in New Brun-  
swick, bound to a locality where moose,

numerous. Charles Barker, my guide,  
who was familiar with the country, to-

of the horses and with their axes cut the  
fallen timber out of the old logging road

ed our outfit on our backs.

This part of our route was not of the  
picnic order. Far from it. The  
weather was very warm; the flies were  
biting awfully and we were following no  
trail save an occasional narrow one that  
led in the desired direction. These many  
difficulties, however, led us to make the  
trip, as we were less likely to interfere  
with or be disturbed by other parties than  
in any region which could be reached by  
some route or road. On the day
