STORY OF THE SPEEDY

Indirectly connected with dredging is the engaging story of the steamer Speedy, purchased in 1904 in New York, second hand, for the purpose of towing dredges and barges on inland waters. On the side, so to speak, the Speedy has been used as a "despatch boat," that is to say, by the Minister of Public Works and other politicians to go little jaunts of their own. There are still two or three Ministers who have no private car, and have to be content with a yacht. Mr. Brodeur's yacht is dignified as an ice-breaker, and has some \$3,000 worth of silver plate and cut glass in the dining room. The corresponding boat on the Pacific is called a lighthouse tender. On the Atlantic the like craft are supposed to protect the fisheries. But we have now to speak of the towboat Speedy.

PLUS COMMISSION.

Mr. Howden, Superintendent of Dredging, testified to the Public Accounts Committee that he went to New York and purchased this boat for \$35,000. True, there was a further sum of \$1,750 commission, but the officer explained that this was paid to a New York Broker. The boat was seven or eight years old and was bought furnished ready for towing.

The result of these things is that the Speedy has down to this year cost over \$100,000, and has done about as much towing as could have been performed by a private craft for a twentieth of the money.

The Election Task.
