

THE O'BRIEN GOES EAST.

He Will Travel Through American Territory to Montreal.

NIAGARA FALLS, Ont., May 25.—Mr O'Brien left the Falls for Montreal by the New York Central to Albany, thence to Montreal via Rouse's Point, at 4 this afternoon. He was accompanied to the depot by a deputation of friends. He complained of pain in the back and side. The people cheered him as the train pulled out of the station.

MONTREAL, May 25.—At a meeting of the Executive Committee of the Irish National League held tonight, it was announced that as Mr O'Brien would not arrive until 10.40 p.m. tomorrow night, the demonstration is to be put off until Friday evening. When he arrives tomorrow night, he will be informally received by the presidents of the various Irish societies.

MONTREAL, May 25.—The Executive Committee of the Irish National League have completed arrangements for Mr O'Brien's arrival. He will arrive at Bonaventure depot at 8 o'clock, and from there will be escorted by torchlight procession. He will then address an open air meeting in Chaboulet square, after which some of his friends will tender him a banquet.

SYRACUSE, N. Y., May 25.—Mr O'Brien stopped here for one or two hours on his way to Montreal, and evaded the crowd that was at the depot to meet him. He was driven quietly out in the country and back to the depot and resumed his journey to Albany. He will rest at Albany tonight and set out for Montreal tomorrow morning.

The propeller Tigra brought 1800 tons of freight to Chicago on Tuesday that had been shipped in New York on Friday. This beats all previous records.

It is reported that there is a gigantic scheme on foot to consolidate all the cattle interests of the Northwest and form a company which shall control \$15,000,000 worth of cattle and grazing lands. The scheme originated with the Wyoming Stock Association of Cheyenne and is the outgrowth of the combination of the smaller cattle men into companies which has been going on for several years.

The cost of revising the voters' lists in Perth, under the Dominion Franchise Act, amounted to \$4,640, and the salaries are not yet paid in full.

The German Reichstag has approved of the International treaties for the protection of works of literature and art and of submarine cables.

A dynamite bomb was exploded under the Police court at Hepburn, Durham, Tuesday, partially destroying the building. The outrage is attributed to strikers.

London has exempted the Ontario Rolling Mill Company from taxes and water rates for ten years on condition that they employ not less than fifty men.

Mrs. Robert Galloway of St. Thomas, injured some time ago while coming out of the post-office, has entered an action for damages against the Dominion Government.

Quebec, May 22.—Lieutenant-Governor Masson forwarded his resignation to Ottawa yesterday in consequence of ill-health. Mr. Masson only consented to remain in office until the end of the session, and now that it is over, and that his indisposition continues, he insists upon resigning. It is supposed here that Sir John Macdonald will endeavor to turn the occasion to his advantage by trying to appoint one of his French-Canadian Ministers to the vacant office, thus hoping to remove from his Cabinet one of the parties to a serious rivalry. Friends of the respective members here express the belief that neither Sir Hector Langevin, Sir Adolphe Caron nor Mr. Chapleau will accept the office.
