WEEK-END CABLES, deliverable on MONDAY MORNING instead of TUESDAY as heretofore, are accepted at ONE DOLLAR AND FIFTEEN CENTS (\$1.15) FOR 24 WORDS, AND FIVE CENTS FOR EACH ADDITIONAL WORD.
