## YOUR BOYS AND GIRLS

The busy mother who must spend part of her day at least in the kitchen, and many hours at her sewing machine, is often puzzled to know what to do with the little one who has just begun to creep. Turning her back for an instant he may make a dash for the top of the stairs or pull down upon his head a whole dresserful of bottles and ornaments by catching hold of the fringe of the skirt that dangles within his reach.

You can make a pen from a small inexpensive kitchen table placed upside down on the floor. The four legs are wound about with small clothes-line rope wrapped with strips of cotton flannel. These are tacked to the posts, likewise wrapped, about half a foot apart. In the bottom of the pen is placed a thick quilt, drawn well over the sides to protect the baby's head from a bump against the boards should he topple over.

A pillow is placed at one side, ready for his occasional nap or his long, after-lunch snooze. His tops are put in the pen with easy reach, but he cannot well fling them about.

## Household Notes.

Any bits of left-over jam or jelly added to the filling for pumpkin pie will improve the flavor.

Doily luncheon napkins are made of squares of linen, finished with a crocheted picot edge.

Carbolic acid is a good disinfectant, but useless unless diluted with at least twenty times its bulk of cold water.

If a little ammonia is mixed with the beeswax and turpentine used for floor polishing, the wax will dissolve quickly.

Prevent the frying eggs from sputtering and flying by adding a generous pinch of flour to the fat, and stirring it.

If the closet where you hang tins and cooking utensils is badly lighted, try painting the hooks and nails white.

Chamois leathers should be washed in tepid water and dried with the soap in them; they will then be nice and soft.

Camphor will remove fruit stains from table linen. Before the linen goes into the wash go over the spots with camphor.

If the hair is dry and brittle, give it a good application of vaseline or pure olive oil on the scalp the night before shampooing.

A wringer that is strained from wringing colored cloths can be cleaned by rubbing the rollers with a cloth saturated in paraffin.

Every growing child should rest one hour each day. If this rule is followed it is not so apt to take colds or any infectious disease.

Unwisely cracks on furniture can easily be filled with beeswax. Soften the beeswax until pliable, then press it firmly into the cracks.

If a tablecloth is beyond repair, cut it up into various sized pieces, hem them around and they will be found most useful in the kitchen.

Pickles and vinegar should be kept in glass jars or bottles. When kept in glazed ware the vinegar acts on the glaze and forms a poison.

Cardboard boxes cut into convenient sizes will provide you with excellent scrapers with which to clean trash out of the kitchen sink.

Always start the rice pudding on top of the stove, allow it to boil, stirring it frequently, until the rice is done, then set it in the oven to brown.

When making pancakes, put one rounded tablespoonful of lard into the mixture and you will not have to grease the pan and the cakes will not stick.

A palatable way to serve cold, boiled potatoes is to put them through the sieve. Season them well with butter and salt; form into cones and brown in the oven.

Do not water window plants, unless the soil looks dry. Put enough water on the plant to moisten the soil all through. Too frequent watering will sour the soil.

When fish comes into the house a few hours before it is cooked, it should be cleaned, wiped dry and put into a closely covered vessel, not tin, and put as near the ice as possible.

Most cereals should be thoroughly washed before they are cooked. After putting the dry cereal in the vessel, fill it to the top with water and see how much trash will float off.

When a garment has become grimy with dirt, do not wear it out with rubbing, but put it on to boil in water to which a little kerosene has been added. This will loosen grime as nothing else will.
