#### Bonar Law Very Sick Man Indeed.

"WEAKENED MORALE" SCARE DELAYED PRIME MINISTER HOLIDAVING EARLIER.

LONDON-Bonar Law's holiday which has just begun would have been taken earlier but for fear that his ilElhealth would be used as a scare to weaken the morale of the Conservative party. He is a very sick man indeed, and it is not only his throat that troubles him. The throat trouble is of the obscure kind which mystified doctors and Premier Law always replies to enquiries from friends saying he does not know what is the matter with it. His old trouble of high blood pressure has not been eliminated, and he can only guard against it producing serious consequences by avoiding fatigue, which is hardly possible for any man leading the House of Commons to do.

Conservative ex-leaders Chamberlain, Horne, Birkenhead and Worthington Evans, who, in words of Birkenhead, failed to see ways the cat would jump, are believed to be banking on the Prime Minister's physical breakdown to force the party to beg for their aid, which will be given on terms. The terms are that they shall all be restored to office, including Birkenhead, whose waspish tongue against old colleagues has made reconciliation with him very

unpalatable. The junior men who are now in the Cabinet are naturally not desirous of stepping down to make room for others especially as these others make insidious claim to superior brains. One Conservative paper which urges the restoration of Chamberlainites makes great capital out of the supposition that the present ministry is weak in parliamentary debating power and popular platform power. Lord Younger, still the most of the "Die-hards" boldly asserting that the front-bench occupants are a very able set. The press, which suports the Government, is trying hard to improve the reputations of its members for peronal ability. Baldwin's handling of the budget has been represented as a ph. In short, the Government defenders are adopting the Coue treatment of asserting that they are always getting better and better in order to counteract their opponents taunts of their lacking first-class brains.
