Trade with New Zealand

Log Increase in Past Year on Amount We Sold Colony.

Ottawa, Sept. 28.—Canada's trade with New Zealand is increasing by leaps and bounds, Mr. J. S. Larke, the Canadian commercial commissioner at Sydney, reports that last year Canada sold to the New Dominion goods to a value of \$205,536, as against only \$52,374 in 1932. In the same time we bought from New Zealand \$73,615 worth as against \$7,366 worth in 1932.

The trade in printing paper has grown from \$18,752 in 1935 to \$33,599 in 1936 and \$69,655 in 1937. Most of this was sent from Ottawa.

New Zealand has prohibited the importation of prison-made goods and the United States has been sending there a quantity of harvesting tools necessary to the New Dominion to increase their trade with the southern colony.

BANKRUPT STOCK MAN WAS COMMITTED

expenses. She had not been asked to do the work by Head. She had charge of the cash while Patten kept the bank account. Despite this, the witness had done the greater part of the work.

The stock was taken from North Bay and Patten had been drunk for a week in Piquette, the witness denied it, but stated that he might have been in the city on the night. He did not spend any of the firm's funds, neither did he spend all the money he had in his possession, although he had \$20 of personal funds.

The Bank Manager.
Mr. Preston, manager of the Traders' Bank at Ripley, was then called, as he desired to be on the stand. He produced the original ledger of the firm's account at the bank. There had been some trouble on one occasion when the plaintiff presented an order for the full amount to Patten & Co.'s credit. This order was refused as the signature was not sufficient. The ledger left showed the deposits and withdrawals of the firm.

Mr. Meredith made a strong plea for the defendant and asked the magistrate to dismiss the case. In his opinion it was not theft on the part of a partner to draw the money he had in the firm, but to draw an interest. On several occasions Patten had opportunities to draw even more money, but had not done so.

His honor was of the opinion that the defendant did not intentionally commit a criminal act, but was guilty of a dishonest action in appropriating the funds to his own use when there was still an opportunity to return the money. Had he done what was right he would have left the money until matters were settled satisfactorily.

A SOUTH AFRICAN VETERANS' ASSOCIATION

The London Branch Was Formed at a Meeting Held Last Night.

A branch of the South African Veterans' Association of Canada was formed in this city last evening, to be known as the South African Association of Military District No. 1. The move was made at a meeting of about twenty local veterans in the Armories.

The main aim of the association, as is well known, is the modification of the Dominion law in regard to the grants of land in the west, given the veteran, by the Government. Permission is desired to allow substitutes to perform the necessary service duties.

A delegate to the general convention, to be held shortly in Winnipeg, was appointed in the person of Mr. Harry Chapman, of that city, formerly of London. The following officers were elected: Messrs. J. A. Wilson, Turner, J. England, J. Penwarden, J. Yman. The officers are: Burton, Col. Peters, D.C., honorary president, Col. McDougall, president, Capt. Becher, first vice-president, Sgt. Major Borland, second vice-president, Capt. McCrimmon, secretary, Sgt. Foster.

Messrs. Hessel and A. Burwell will act as auditors.

MINISTER'S ABSENCE CAUSES COMMENT

Failed to Appear and Preach His Farewell Sermon.

Sarnia, Sept. 28.—The non-appearance of Rev. Mr. Evans at St. John's Anglican Church on Sunday is the subject of much comment. Mr. Evans had been announced to preach his farewell sermon prior to starting for England on a six months' leave of absence. He was also announced to hold harvest festival services at the English Church on the Sarnia reserve on Sunday afternoon, but he failed to put in an appearance there. Rev. Mr. Evans left town Saturday afternoon, and as yet has not returned or given any explanation regarding his absence.

Mrs. Emma E. wife of Mr. s.w.m. Eady, of Talford street, died at the Sarnia General Hospital, Sunday, from typhoid fever, after an illness of three weeks. The remains were taken to the residence of her brother-in-law, Wm. Dunlop, Petrolia, and the funeral will be held from there to Hillsdale Cemetery.

A Port Huron boy named Samuel Anter narrowly escaped drowning in sight of several hundred people in St. Clair River, opposite Pine Grove Park, Sunday afternoon. The boy got beyond his depth and was going down for the third time, when Burt Alexander jumped into the river with all of his clothes on and safely brought young Anter to shore.

ITALY, AUSTRIA AS PEACEMAKERS

Ministers Plan to Prevent Rupture Between Germany and England or France.

Rome, Sept. 29.—The meeting between Signor Tittoni, Italian minister of foreign affairs, and Baron Aehrenthal, Austrian minister of foreign affairs, which took place at Salzburg, Austria, after the many other meetings which occurred during the summer among sovereigns and statesmen, has assumed a special importance, particularly because Signor Tittoni had first an interview with Baron von Sechoen, German minister of foreign affairs. Notwithstanding the efforts to keep the reasons of the meeting secret it is now known that the discussion was on other principal subjects—Anglo-German relations, the situation in Turkey and the Moroccan affair.

The question of the relations between England and Germany affects both Austria and Italy, as both have traditionally followed a policy of friendship with England, while they are both now pledged to support Germany on account of the triple alliance. This situation is especially grave for Italy, as she cannot possibly have Great Britain as an enemy in the Mediterranean. From this point of view the present conditions are worse than those last spring, as the London meeting between King Edward and the Kaiser, there is no concealing it, was a complete fiasco. The British had attempted again to limit his armaments, the latter answered with his toast at Strasbourg, which sounded more like a war cry. Aehrenthal and Tittoni agreed to do all in their power to have the combined Austro-Italian influence used in England, as well as in Germany, to clear away the present clouds.

With regard to the situation in Turkey, it was decided to wait further developments in the new republic, although complications are feared in Bosnia and Herzegovina, where a strong anti-Austrian party is working for the autonomy of these provinces, or for their reunion to the Turkish empire, now that constitutional Government is established.

Finally Morocco again divides the powers as before and during the Algeiras conference, Germany, supported by Austria, wishes to acknowledge the new Sultan, Mulai Hadid, while France desires to temporize, and is backed by England and Spain. Italy is in the usual state of embarrassment, while the ally of Germany and Austria, she has special arrangements with France and England regarding the Mediterranean.

She must therefore try to repeat the game she played at Algeiras—that of not falling between two stools. At Algeiras, however, she was represented by one of her most authoritative and influential men, Marquis Visconti Venosta, who found in Mr. Henry Wilson, the American representative, a most valuable co-operator. Will Signor Tittoni be able to repeat success in this position? He is trying it now with Von Sechoen and with Aehrenthal.

DROPPED 6,000 FEET

Two Prussian Aeronauts Have Remarkable Adventure.

Dusseldorf, Rhenish Prussia, Sept. 29.—Captain Von Abercron and Lieut. Von Gotthardt, two well-known aeronauts, had a miraculous escape from death yesterday during the course of an ascent in a spherical balloon. Thousands of spectators had gathered to witness the ascent, and they were horror-stricken at the accident, which occurred high in the air.

On being released from its fastenings, the balloon soared almost upwards to an altitude of 6,000 feet when the envelope suddenly ripped open. The gas escaped in a stream and the balloon shot downward. The aeronauts swiftly clambered into the network in the desperate hope of avoiding the shock of contact with the ground. After a fall of 2,000 feet, however, the envelope spread out, seemingly in a purely accidental manner, forming a sort of parachute which checked the descent. The balloon then gradually came down, taking an hour and a half to reach the earth, the two men clinging to the ropes of the basket. They suffered no injury except a few scratches.

The cause of the accident was the sudden expansion of the gas.
