MARRIAGE LAWS IN FEDERAL TERRITORIES

Ministers of Justice Says Except Where Modified Law of England Rules.

of England Rules.

[Canadian Press.]
Ottawa, Dec. 5.—The Minister of Justice today gave his answers to the questions asked by J. H. Burnham, M. P. for West Peterboro, as to marriage laws in federal territory. Mr. Burnham asked:

"1. What portions of the Dominion of Canada are solely under federal control and jurisdiction?

"2. What are the laws with respect to marriage in these districts?"
Hon. Mr. Doherty replied:

"1. The territory which remains subject to the legislation of the Dominion, and not subject to any provincial powers, is comprised in the Northwest Territories and the Yukon Territory, being all that part of the Dominion not included within the boundaries of any province.

"2. The law affecting marriage in the Northwest Territories is the law of England as the same existed on July 15th, 1870, in so far as applicable and in so far as not repealed, altered, varied, modified or affected by any act of parliament of the United Kingdom or of the parliament of Canada, applicable to the territories or by any ordinance of the Northwest Territories.

"The law affecting marriage in the Yukon Territory is that which was in force in the Northwest Territories on June 13, 1898, in so far as applicable, and in so far as not repealed, abolished or altered by the parliament of Canada, or by any ordinance of the governor-incouncil or the commissioner-in-council under the provisions of the Yukon act."
