CARRIES ISSUE TO APPELLATE COURT
Telegraph Company Declines To Submit Files in Hudson Probe.
TORONTO, May 12.—Whether the telegrams passing between the Telegraph, of Toronto, and its correspondents in Fort Frances and Winnipeg, relating to the matter of the death of Captain Huston at Fort Frances in December last, shall be produced as evidence before the McIntosh commission now inquiring into the mystery, will remain for the appellate court to decide on Monday.
A battle was staged before the commission over the telegrams today, Gordon Waldron, K.C., for the government insisting that they should be produced, and J. C. Spence, K.C., for the C. P. R. Telegraph Company, being equally insistent that they should not be produced.
When Commissioner McIntosh seemed disposed to admit the telegrams, Mr. Spence announced that he would take the matter to a higher court, to which the commissioner agreed. The application will be heard before the court on Monday, and in the meantime the telegrams have been placed in an envelope and turned over to the court registrar.
The hearing for the present was concluded in Toronto this afternoon. Gordon Waldron left tonight for Fort Frances, and will resume the inquiry in that town on Monday morning. Subsequently a sitting will be held in Winnipeg.

CYCLONE IN MANITOBA.
WINNIPEG, May 12.—A small cyclone is reported to have passed over Rosefield, Man., southwest of this city, last night. No casualties resulted, but slight property damage occurred.
Several buildings were partially wrecked, including an empty house, which was torn from its foundations.
