Shanghai, July 20.—The report from London of the powers' consent to hold a judicial inquiry into the May 30 Shanghai shooting incident has met with the greatest approbation here on the part of the municipal council, foreign consulates and Chinese and foreign business interests. The inquiry board is expected to consist of an American, Briton and Chinese, without a Japanese.
