In consequence, however, of the large reduction in the value of money, the profits do not bear the same proportion to the extent of business transacted as in former years, but they have enabled your Directors to pay the usual dividend of eight per cent. and provide for all the bad and doubtful debts of the year, leaving a surplus of \$105,819 14.

From this sum \$14,396 has been transferred to reserve for rebate of interest on current discounts, bringing that fund up to \$150,000, which is regarded as sufficient for the purpose, and will not in the meantime require to be further increased. The remaining \$91,423 14 has been carried to Profit and Loss, making that account \$319,971.39.
