London, Dec. 31—The New Year's honors list this year is a short one. Canada is well represented in the colonist list, which is headed by Robert L. Borden, the Canadian premier, who becomes a privy councillor.

Osler, of Toronto, both members of the Canadian parliament, Knights Bachelor.

Alberta to Have  
Single Tax System

Premier Sifton Introduces Bill to Provide Municipal Constitution.

Edmonton, Dec. 20—Premier Sifton has introduced a bill in the Alberta Legislature which stipulates that within seven years the single tax principle shall be observed by all established municipalities, and that it shall be observed from the outset by municipalities hereafter established in Alberta.

The bill, in its entirety, will provide a model constitution for municipalities now in existence and that will be created in the future in this Province. It contains 37 sections, and it is the aim of the Government to include in these every consideration that enters into the administration of a municipality.

New York, Dec. 27—A despatch from Bombay, says that King George had a narrow escape from death while hunting in Nepal. Although every precaution possible had been taken to protect the life of His Majesty, an enormous tiger, streaked with blood from several wounds, and frantic with pain and rage, leaped upon the elephant from whose back the King did his shooting, before it was finally put to death. The King's nerve remained unshaken, and the tiger fell to the ground, with two well directed bullets through its head, fired by the marksmen on either side of his majesty. The king who had fired first, missed his aim.
