A STEADYING-UP IN WHEAT.

NEW YORK STOCK MARKET DUL AND FEATURELESS.

The Money Market—Montreal and Toronto Stock Exchanges—Grain and Flour—Produce and Provisions—Beechwood's Report—Liverpool Markets—N. Y. Cotton Exchange—Miscellaneous.

Tuesday Evening, July 16. Dominion Bank stock sold today at 23 1/2, an advance of 1/4 over last transaction.

At 2 p.m. to-day December wheat was quoted on the curb in Chicago at 87 1/2.

Consols closed at 97 1/2 for money, 95 1/2 for account, a decline of 1/2.

Advices received today from New York state that the sugar market is strong with an advancing tendency both in raw and refined.

A feature of the local market was the activity and strength of Bank of Commerce stock, an aggregate of 172 shares selling at 129 1/2 to 129 3/4.

J. J. Dixon & Co.'s Chicago correspond writes: "We predict a further advance in wheat prices will be December wheat back to 90."

Advices from Chicago state that packing returns were up 1/2 in the west of river and down 1/2 in the summer season to date.

Transactions on the local Stock Exchange amounted to 40 shares, of which 20 were in North-West Land, compared with yesterday, on Montreal Exchange against 110.

There was a slight reaction in American wheat markets to-day and December generally closed around yesterday's figures. In New York at 96 1/2 and closed at 96 1/2. In Chicago at 87 1/2 and closed at 87 1/2.
