

Re Transfers. Editor World: Would it not be well to ex periment on 10 tickets for a quarter rather than 10 and 8 as you suggest in this morn ing's paper? I believe it would be found that sunh a consent change would be of mutual benefit to both city and company. Let us take Yonge-street route to illustrate. There are about 13 cars in use, each carrying about 900 paying passengers and 300 transfers per day. The receipts are about \$450 from the combined total of 15,600. At a 10 for a quarter ticket, no transfers, the same number of passengers would pay \$330. To this must be added the saving due to removal of transfer agents, probably equal to \$12 per day, thus leaving some \$48 of a deficit. 
