An Inquest. Coroner Charles Gooch charged the body, and has ordered a post-mortem examination to be made by Dr. John H. McEwen, who has been retained for an inquest at Young's mortuary to-night at 8 o'clock, when preliminary evidence will be given. An adjournment will be necessary to obtain the evidence of witnesses living in Severn Bridge. The body will be taken to Severn Bridge for interment to-morrow morning.
