Mr. Stirling; we have this year missionary catechists in the fol-bring places, viz. : in Glassville and Florenceville, Mr. Chase, in Baillie, i.e., Mr. Cumming, in St. George, Mr. Lawson, in Albert Co., Mr. Sinclair, ral in Acton Mr. Hood; that visits of the convener, Mr. McNab and others Salt Springs, Golden Grove, and, various stations in Albert were made, and is hoped have been productive of considerable permanent advantage; that in Gassville a church is being erected, one also at Salt Springs is in progress, and the reople of Hopewell have commenced a subscription for the purpose of building one; tat the Irish General Assembly has granted renewal of vote of former year, and hat the funds of the mission are in a healthy state, but that our liabilities this year nill be large; these liabilities are doubtful depending on the amount subscribed by the congregations to which missionary services are rendered; that the general conand of the districts will be best known from the letters of missionaries which the ammittee would beg to submit in connexion with this report, that the congregations Richmond and Woodstock are seeking to have the Rev. Mr. Simpson as their gmanent minister, and asking supplement from the Home Mission Fund, that the ation of the districts of Golden Grove and Saltsprings has been delayed but should kept in view; also that of Nerepis and Jerusalem as soon as a favorable opportunity insents. Committee further report that Mr. Dunlap not feeling at liberty to accept my of the proposals made by the committee to him regarding fields of labour, withdew from the mission, and at his own request received certificate of demission.committee would recommend that a separate field should be set apart on which to apend the liberality of the Irish Presbyterian Church, as they wished to know secially how their monies are expended. Such special field would form matter of interest for the Irish church colonial report, and probably give permanence to their Eberality.

Letters from the several missionaries were then read, and discussion I the report was proceeded with, when the following resolution was moved and seconded:—That the report be received and approved, the digence of the committee commended, and its convener re-appointed, that the attention of the committee should be directed to the desireableacts of fostering missionary fields into regular charges; that Albert, Fredericton, Glassville, with other districts at the discretion of the committee be associated for a time more definitely and specially with the hish church, and that full reports be sent to the Irish Board with regard w these localities.

Synod proceeded with the consideration of this motion till the hour of adjournment. Session closed with the benediction.

FOURTH SESSION.

Synod met according to adjournment, and being constituted minutes Home Mission. Were read and sustained, when motion on Home Mission report was again brought under discussion. After consideration motion was put and carried unanimously.
