THE WESTMINSTER QUESTION BOOK, FOR 1883 has been issued by the Presbyterian Board of Publication. This is the ninth volume of the series. To those who have used it in the past it is its own recommendation. It is a small, neat, cheap, closely packed book. It contains for each lesson the following:—1. The verses of the lesson; 2. The golden text; 3. A question of the Shorter Catechism; 4. A series of home readings for each day of the week; 5. The topic; 6. The lesson plan; 7. Lesson notes; 8. Questions; 9. Review; 10. Teachings. It probably contains the most instructive in the smallest compass, and at the least cost, of any Sabbath-School help published.
