

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THE CHARTER.

The following are some of the powers conferred by the Charter under the Great Scal of the Dominion of Canada:

(a) Acquiring a tract or tracts of hand in the North West Territories of Canada, with a view of colonizing and settling the same.

(b) With power of contract with the purchasers and settlers of the lands that intext cating liquors or alcoholic boverages shell not be manufactured or sold in the settlement. (c) To purchase, take, lease, or otherwise acquire any real and personal property and any rights or privileges necessary or convenient for the Company in up part of Canada.

(d) To develope the resources of the lands acquired by building, planting, cloating, cultivating or otherwise dealing with the same.

(c) To aid, encourage and promote immigration into the property of the Company, and to colonize the same, and for the purpose aforesaid to lend and granting money of lines of steamboats or barges from and through the lands of the Company to some point or place on or near and in connection with an existing or established lines of railway, and to make, provide and earry on, use and work transvays, telegraph lines, canals, reservoirs, aqueducis, roads, streets, and other works which may be deemed expedient in promoting the objects of the Company.

(g) To buy, manufacture and sell all kinds of goods, cluttles and effects required for the Company, or by any person who may settle on the property of the Company.

(h) And for such purposes to have oil necessary powers for borrowing and investment monors, solling and disposing of reals and personal property, and such other powers as no necessary and incident thereto throughout the Dominion of Canada.
