What is the Society in England doing?

It is organizing and rousing the National Church to do battle with the National sin.

It has more than 1,000 branches spread throughout every Diocese in England and Wales, besides many in India and the Colonies.

These are affording a scope for the energies of Lay-workers in carrying the Gospel to poor drunkards, of both sexes, formerly regarded as hopeless outcasts.

Prevention, as well as cure, is carefully cultivated, and the young, in hundreds of thousands, are being trained as Abstainers and Soldiers in the Crusade.

With the valued aid of many who are not Total Abstainers, counterattractions, such as Coffee-houses, cocoa and reading-rooms, clubs, concerts, lectures, instructive entertainments, penny-banks; &c. &c., are competing with much success, with the public house and gin palace.

Public Opinion is being power fully influenced.

Social customs rapidly modified. Many hundreds of Temperance sermons are preached overy year, and more than 1,000 meetings, held every week by the various branches.

Publications. — The "C. E. T. Chronicle (1d weekly); The Young Standard Bearer, for children (\frac{1}{2}d) monthly).

One and a third millions of tracts leaflets, stories, cards, and other publications are distributed yearly by the depot at Westminster.

The official staff of the Society (including the officers of affiliated branches) consists of:

Superintendent (Hon. Clerical), Assistant Secretary and cashier.

25 Diocesan Organizing Secretaries (of whom 17 are clerical), actively spreading the work into fresh parishes, with the help or sanction of the clergy, and sup-port the great army of voluntary workers.

12 Missionaries [one of them a lady], attending Police Courts filled chiefly by the criminal intemperate.

5 Female Missionaries employed by branches of the Women's Union and two collectors.

6 Officers of the seven Central departments, viz. :

1. Publication depot, manager.

2. Legi-lative depart, worked by superintendent.

3. Women's Union, lady secretery.

4. Juvenile Union, lady secre-

tary.
5. Agricultural depart. worked by assistant secretary.

6. Army division, organizing agent.
7. Cabmen and 'busmen's divi-

sion, agent.

Each department (with one exception) is directed by a special sub-committee, appointed by the central executive.
