SIR,

Оттаwа, August 31, 1935.

I have the honour to refer to your Note of August 2nd respecting tariff relations between Canada and the Union of South Africa, and to accept, on behalf of His Majesty's Government in Canada, the proposal of your Government for the exchange of treatment not less favourable than that accorded the most favoured foreign nation in respect to Customs duties under the terms and conditions therein set forth.

It is understood that your Note under reference and this reply will constitute an Agreement between our two Governments with effect from July 1st, 1935, provided it shall lapse if not ratified by the Parliament of the Union of South Africa by Resolution of both Houses during the next ensuing Session. is further understood that this Agreement shall be terminable by six months notice on either side.
