- (b) otherwise determined in writing between the Parties.
- 2. Tritium-related technology shall remain subject to this Protocol until otherwise determined in writing between the Parties.

ARTICLE 10

Physical Protection

The Parties shall apply, within their respective jurisdictions, all necessary measures to ensure the physical protection of tritium, tritium-related equipment and tritium-related technology subject to this Protocol to protect, *inter alia*, against theft and unauthorized use.

ARTICLE 11

Administrative Understandings

In accordance with Article VII of the Agreement, the Parties, through their respective appropriate governmental authorities, namely, for Canada the Canadian Nuclear Safety Commission, and for Romania the National Commission for Nuclear Activities Control, shall establish administrative understandings to facilitate the effective implementation of this Protocol. Such understandings will include the procedures necessary for the appropriate governmental authorities to implement and administer the provisions of this Protocol, taking into account Romania's obligations under the EURATOM Treaty.

ARTICLE 12

Protection of Confidential Information

- 1. The Parties shall take reasonable precautions to preserve the confidentiality of information, including commercial and industrial secrets, transferred between them or between persons under their respective jurisdiction pursuant to the Agreement or this Protocol.
- 2. A Party supplying information pursuant to the Agreement or this Protocol that it considers to be confidential, shall take reasonable precautions to ensure that the information is clearly identified as confidential, in accordance with the law or policies of the Party.
