NEW POSTAL GUIDE AND INFORMATION BOOKLET

Hon. Jean-Pierre Côté (Postmaster General): 1. The Post Office Department has no plans at this time to issue a new postal guide. It is expected the department will publish a new postal information booklet in both languages in April of 1967.

2. The Canada Postal Guide, Part 1, "Postal Law and General Information" was issued in both languages on the 30th June 1965. Six revisions have been issued to date. Part 2, "International Mails Rates and Conditions" was issued in both languages on the 1st October 1963. Nine revisions have been issued to date. The last postal information booklet was published by the department in 1963.
