break in the Telegraph Cable in British Columbia, its attempted repair, the arrangements for a Ferry to replace it, and the cost thereof.

Mr. Blake moved, that an Order of The House do issue, for a copy of all Correspondence, Statements and representations upon which the Government acted in proposing the Legislation of 1849, and also the Legislation of 1880, as to the specific gravity of Coal Oil used for illuminating purposes; and for copies of any correspondence, Statements and representations on the subject of the operation of either of the said Acts, and any suggestions received as to the amendment of the present Act in that respect.

And a Debate arising thereon,—the said motion was, with leave of The House, withdrawn.

A Message was received from the Senate, agreeing to the Bill No. 49 to amend "The General Inspection Act 1874," and the Acts amending it, without amendment.

Also,—with the following Bills of their own, to which the concurrence of this House was desired, viz:—

No. 74 intituled: "An Act to incorporate "The Napierville Junction Railway and Quarry Company." (On motion of Mr. Coursol, the said Bill was read the first time; and ordered for a second reading, to-morrow).

No. 75 intituled: "An Act to amend the Petroleum Inspection Act, 1880." (On motion of Mr. Mousseau, the said Bill was read the first time, and ordered for a second reading, to morrow).

Mr. Langevin laid before The House, by command of His Excellency the Governor General,—Annual Report of the Minister of Public Works, for the fiscal year 1st July, 1879, to the 30th June, 1880, on the works under his control.

And also,—Address to His Excellency the Governor General, for a copy of all Reports, correspondence and telegrams between Mr. J. W. Trutch and the Government, respecting the Railway lands in British Columbia.
