

PRAYERS.

The Honourable Senator Vien moved that it be:—

Resolved,—That in the opinion of the Senate, it is expedient that the Government should introduce a measure to provide for the consolidation and revision of the Statutes of Canada, in view of the fact that since the last consolidation and revision in 1927 a great number of Statutes have been enacted, and amendments made, and the abundance of these enactments and amendments has rendered references thereto and the interpretation thereof difficult.

After debate, and—

The question being put on the said motion, it was—

Resolved in the affirmative.

Pursuant to the Order of the Day, the Senate resumed the adjourned debate on the inquiry by the Honourable Senator Dupuis—That he will call the attention of the Senate to the desirability of establishing a national organization in co-operation with all the Provincial Governments, whose functions would be to help mothers, to develop infant health and to reduce to its minimum infantile mortality.
