

ESTIMATES FOR TORONTO SCHOOLS REACH MORE THAN TWO MILLIONS

This Includes Only Maintenance and Provision for Sites, New Schools and Additions to Present Buildings—Administration Building is Provided for.

Building department estimates, totaling \$2,448,700, were sent forward to the board of education yesterday by its property committee. This includes only maintenance and building site estimates for high and public schools, and is \$15,450 less than last year.

Money for sites and enlargement of sites is the largest single item. For this \$500,000 was thought needed. The total public school building draft is \$1,800,000 and the high school building is \$706,000. Public school maintenance is set at \$214,100 and high school and collegiate institute at \$28,900.

Provision for the much talked-of administration building is made in the estimates prepared. For the building proper \$100,000 is set aside, and another \$100,000. There is some intricate bookkeeping in this account, whereby the advisory committee's estimate must pay about \$60,000 of the site cost and the board proper the remainder.

Some of the other larger items are: North Toronto high school enlargement by six class rooms and assembly hall, \$70,000; high school repairs, \$10,000; public school repairs, \$150,000;

new furniture, \$23,250; to replace and supplement Park and Seckville Street Schools by a new building of thirty-five rooms, \$210,000; to enlarge Roden School by six rooms, \$35,000; the same to Duke of Cornwall School, \$35,000; adding six rooms to Franklin School, \$40,000; adding nine rooms to Withrow Avenue School, \$60,000; adding four rooms to John Fisher School, \$25,000; to replace and supplement Jesse Ketchum and Cottingham Schools by a thirty-one room building, \$185,000; enlarging Humber Street School by six rooms, \$20,000; adding nine rooms to Ryerson School, \$60,000; to replace and supplement Glavin and Crawford Streets Schools, \$18,000; adding nine rooms to Alexander Muir School, \$50,000; adding nineteen rooms to Regal Road School, \$115,000; accommodation for manual training and domestic science, \$20,000; adding twelve rooms to Annette Street School, \$30,000; adding ten rooms to Brock Avenue School, \$70,000.

The largest decrease from last year's building department estimates is in the public school building and sites item, where \$313,000 was taken out.

THAWED OUT PIPES WITH BLAZING RAGS MAYOR DECLINED TO TAKE PROFITS

Starting from the blazing rags, used to thaw out water pipes, fire did \$200 damage to the residence of C. B. Vernon, 8 Robinson street, early yesterday morning. The damage, valued at \$200 was done to the furniture of the house.

REAR ADMIRALS PINK TEA IDOLS

Senator Caustic in Criticism of the Rule of Precedence.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 13.—How a British naval commander in Mexican waters might assume command over American forces by virtue of his seniority of rank was discussed in animated debate in the senate today during the debate on the bill for six American vice-admirals. Senator Thomas could not understand why an American rear-admiral should surrender command of his forces to a foreigner.

"Such a custom reduces the science of war to a mere puppet," he declared. "He suggested that a Chinese ship under such a command might lead an American fleet thru the Panama Canal."

The view that the Mexican factions should be allowed to adjust their differences without outside interference was expressed when the American government gave notice to the world of its intention to enforce the exportation of arms to Mexico had been raised. Officials pointed out today that similar expressions had been communicated to other nations.

ALMOST LOST HIS CASE

The case was called, and as there was no lawyer present, it was set for the plaintiff, a non-suit was entered.

At 10.20 Alexander McGregor appeared on behalf of Scully, and declared that he had mistaken the hour for the opening of court, as he was replacing his brother, John McGregor, who is ill in New York. Justice Latchford thereupon granted a stay of judgment until this morning at 11 o'clock, when the case will be heard in chambers.
